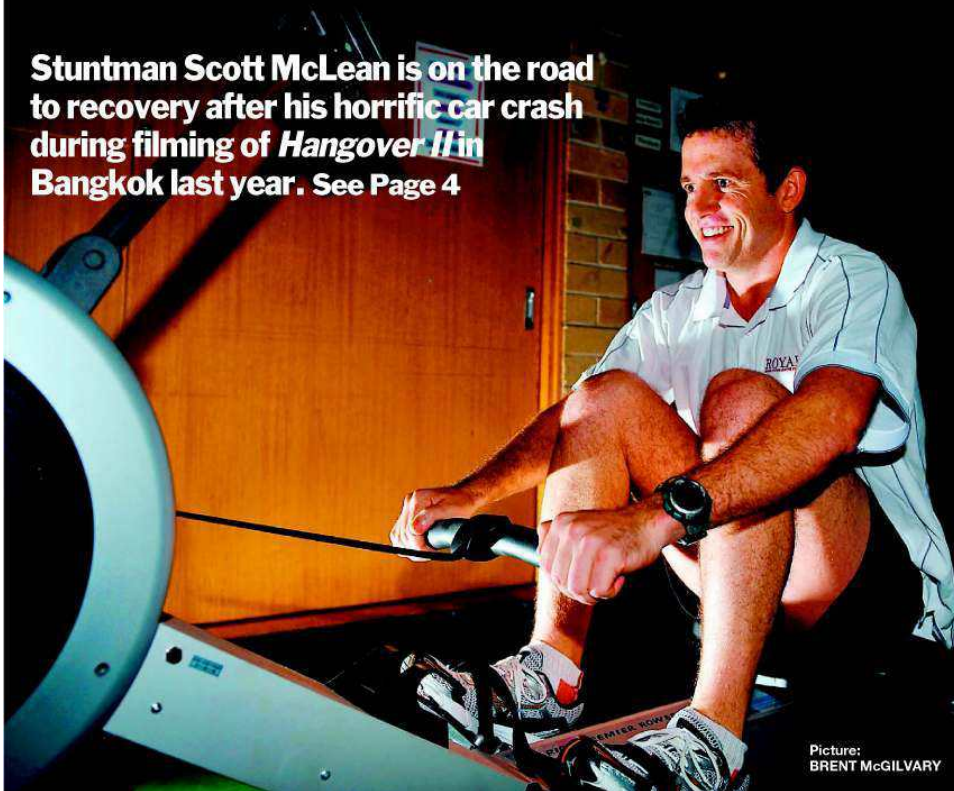

The stuntman of steel

WHEN Scott McLean sustained a severe brain injury during filming of *The Hangover Part II* in Bangkok last year, those closest to him were left wondering about his future.

"It was a horrible time, he was in post traumatic amnesia for five months," McLean's partner of 13 years, Raelene Chapman, said.

But the stuntman, whose credits include *The Matrix*, *Superman* and *Star Wars*, has beaten all odds and is on his way to recovery.

He is now training to run in this year's City2Surf to raise

money for the Royal Rehabilitation Centre.

Fifty people have signed up to run as part of the *Run for Scott* team and more than \$30,000 has been raised for the Royal Rehab's Brain Injury Unit.

"From the moment he arrived at the Royal Rehabilitation Centre Brain Injury Unit, we felt a weight lifted off our shoulders," Ms Chapman said.

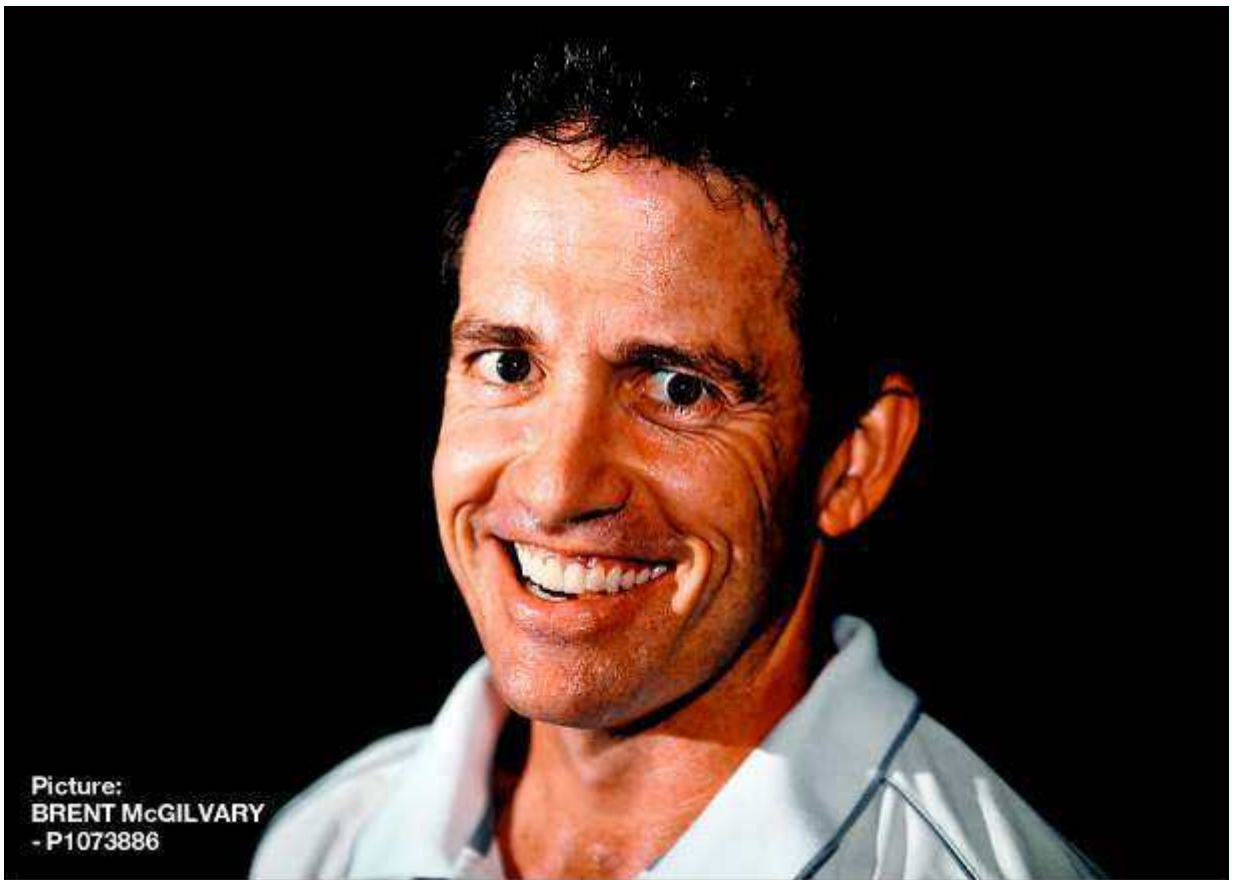
Scott was put in an induced coma for few weeks at a hospital in Bangkok after he was hit by a truck that was supposed to swerve

as part of the stunt.

"Because of his determination and fighting spirit he is making a miraculous recovery with the support from his loving partner and the staff at the Royal Rehabilitation Centre," a friend said.

Royal Rehab CEO Stephen Lowndes said the funds raised will be used to develop and promote new sport and recreation opportunities for people with a disability.
